

Sydney Bertram Carter, poet,

songwriter and folk musician, (born May 6 1915; died March 13 2004) is most famous as the creator of the song "Lord of the dance", Carter said he saw Christ as "the incarnation of the piper who is calling us. He dances that shape and pattern which is at the heart of our reality. By Christ, I mean not only Jesus; in other times and places, other planets, there may be other lords of the dance. But Jesus is the one I know of first and best. I sing of the dancing pattern in the life and words of Jesus." His own faith was informed by a rejection of war and as a committed pacifist and humanitarian was interested in "outsiders and refugees, his own faith with its rejection of dogma, and its reliance on personal experience and social activism, and its affirmation of God's presence in every human being has real resonances for the faith that connects contemporary communities in our own region •

"Bibles, legends, history are signposts: they are pointing to the future, not the past. Do not embrace the past or it will turn into an idol." Jesus was central to his experience, but not, in his words, "the official Jesus - but the Jesus who is calling you to liberty, to the breaking of all idols including the idol which he himself has become." His words continue to challenge today as we rech out to those with complicated realities and different understandings

Your holy hearsay is not evidence Give me the good news in the present tense ... So shut the Bible up and show me how The Christ you talk about is living now.

MEDITATION THE PARABLE OF THE VINEYARD AND THE TENANTS


There was a landowner who planted a vineyard.....he rented it to some farmers ... and sent his servants to collect his rent. (St Matthew Chapter 2: 33-46)

Once again Jesus takes circumstances of the day and weaves them into a story/parable, teaching us about God and ourselves. Every detail was founded upon fact, with the Jewish nation depicted as the vineyard of God. "The vineyard of the Lord of Hosts is the House of Israel". (Isaiah 5:7)

of the Lord of Hosts is the House of Israel". (Isaiah 5:7) Even the action of the farmers was not uncommon. The country was racked by economic unrest, people were discontent and rebellious, and the action of the farmers was not an unlikely scenario.

Firstly the parable tells us about God-

1. God's trust in us. The owner of the vineyard entrusted it to the farmers. He went away leaving it to them. Our Heavenly Father pays us the compliment of



- **2. God's patience -** the owner sent messengers to collect his dues. Even though they were badly treated, he didn't respond with vengeance. He gave the farmers chance after chance to respond to his appeal. Our Heavenly Father bears with us in our sin, and gives us many opportunities.
- **3. God's Judgement –** At last the owner gave the farmers their just retribution. (St Matt 25:31-35)

There will come a time when we face Our Heavenly Father. "When Jesus comes in His glory He will sit on the throne and all the people will be gathered before Him."

Secondly the parable tells us about ourselves -

- **4. We must answer to God** –for all of us there will be a day of reckoning..."for all must appear before the judgement seat of Christ, that each may receive what is due to them for things done while in the body, whether good or bad". (2 Corinthians Chapter 5 verse 10)
- **5. Human Sin –** there is a tendency for humans to deliberately go their own way. To feel they know better than Our Heavenly Father and have no need of Him in their lives. Sin is deliberate opposition to God when we know quite well what the way of God is for us. In this parable it is clear that Jesus knew what lay ahead for Him. (The parable relates how the farmers killed the owner's son.) Our Lord didn't die on the cross because He was compelled to die there. He went willingly to a death orchestrated by the so called representatives of God.

"God wants all people to be saved and come to a knowledge of the truth...there is one mediator between God and people....Christ Jesus who gave Himself as a ransom for all". (I Timothy 2: 4-5)

"He died that we might be forgiven, He died to make us good, That we might go at last to heaven, saved by His precious blood."

Kerry Renews Her Vows

Many of you will be aware that parishioner Kerry Wilkinson has had a special connection for some years with the Community of Christ the King at Taminick, south of Wangaratta. Her association with this Benedictine enclosed community began in 2007 through the encouragement of Fr Paul West. Since the death of Mother Rita Mary last year and the relocation of Sister Patience to St John's Village, there is no longer a functioning Community at the Taminick property. However, there is a group of 17 Oblates, located in Victoria, SA, ACT and Kerry in NSW, who are directly linked with this Community. The word 'Oblate' means 'offering'. Benedictine Oblates live in the outside world but are affiliated with a Benedictine Community and commit to living an enriched Christian life according to the Rule of Benedict.

Kerry was made an Oblate of CCK in 2013, taking the name Kerry Thérèse. On Wednesday 13 July, during the 10.30 Eucharist, she again renewed her vows. This part of the service was led by Fr Malcolm Crawley, who has had a close association with both CCK and the property. In his homily he spoke about St Benedict's life and the huge influence 'the Father of Monasticism' had had in the life of the Church's history. Kerry was supported both by the regular 10.30 congregation and by several friends who came especially for the occasion. She would value your continued encouragement and prayers.




