

**Father Peter writes ;
Dear people of St. Matthew's**

*Come down, O love divine, seek Thou this soul of mine,

Many things "get lost in the translation" "the wonderful Pentecost hymn "come down o love divine" was discovered through translation written in the 15th century by : Bianco of Siena, it was translated into English in 1851; by Richard Littledale, he had very bad health, a very short life of ordained ministry and his poetic and translation output also was cut short, but this magnificent hymn to the Holy spirit continues to be a great gift to the church. The Gifts of the spirit to shake up the world and change things has been lived out in the lives of God's people in quite surprising ways

St Matthews foundation

The Pentecost service also blew in a great bit of news in relation to growing musical ministry with the inauguration of a musical foundation giving tax benefits to donations for musical tuition as part of the musical outreach of st Matthews. With the choir gallery bursting at the seams with new young choristers it was great to see an equally enthusiastic sanctuary team with young people well represented participating in worship offering themselves not just for para church events but throwing their energy into full choral high mass with "the works"

The readers also from the youth group sailed over the difficult Pentecost readings with great assurance and there are immediate plans to share the musical gift with parishes across the diocese through a renewed passion to train organ scholars to minister in variety of congregations .

All this takes vision ,encouragement and money and the day was marked with donations toward providing new choir robes and a second \$5000 donation to kick off the fund to train young church musicians .

The service concluded with the award of medals to members of the choir who had served for 25 years and with young Tom Summerfield giving a spirited rendition of a Mozart fantasia on the theme of Happy Birthday which seemed very appropriate for the "birthday of the church"

Rev Canon Bob Done celebrated 40 years of ordained ministry at a service at Henty on Thursday the 16th of May ,friends from the diocese of Wangaratta and Riverina joined in the celebration which concluded with a lunch at the local club and Fr Bob and others reflected on his ministry and the value of his early rural experience in a long period of ministry to rural communities

Diamond jubilee Coronation evensong

The coronation of Queen Elizabeth 11 took place on the 2nd of June 1953 in Westminster Abbey

A special diamond jubilee choral evensong will be held at 5pm on Sunday 2nd of June 2013 at st Matthews Albury using features of the Abbey service and the famous marble pulpit originally from Westminster Abbey including an extensive display of royal and coronation memorabilia followed by a champagne jubilee supper in the church

One of the canons of Westminster canon Jane Hedges has announced that she will visit st Matthews In August and join the choir in celebrating this jubilee year in the best Westminster tradition also in August Albury Own regiment will be remembered and the pipes and drums of the Scots School Albury will be present and some special vice regal guests are yet to be confirmed.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Landscaping The trees have been lopped except the palm tree near Bellbridge's. At some time the gutters on the Rectory and Church will need to be cleaned.

Solar Panels It would cost approximately \$9,000 to install 20 solar panels on the Rectory roof. The Diocese to be asked if we could borrow money from them. By installing solar panels it would save the parish about \$2,400 per quarter. So in 12 months we would re coup our costs. It would also be environmentally friendly. Perhaps you might like to make a donation towards the cost of a panel.

Church Furniture. Fr Peter & Paul Summerfield visited Bendigo Cathedral to look at the furniture. They have enough furniture to entirely fit out the south transept. They have an altar, pews that match the reredos we might have to consider a swap. Bendigo would like the large wooden candlesticks back.

Website The service times are listed on the site. It has been a great success having the services at the same time each week.

Outreach Pastoral Care. Rev Maureen Beattie and Fr Colin Wellard have been visiting. Rev Maureen has had a meeting in regards to Pastoral Partnership. A memorial service to be held on 10th May. This is being organised by Deacon Heather.

Casseroles Carol Read announced that several people are willing to cook casseroles which Fr Peter can heat up to give to homeless people when they come looking for a meal. They will use the mince which is given to us.

Anglican Food room 38 hampers, \$10 fuel voucher and 242 mince packs distributed in April.

Food bank has opened a new warehouse in Wodonga. For \$200 per year registration we can access what they have for free. Any items we cannot store in our food room it can be kept in the warehouse till we have the room.

Photocopier Fr Alan is looking at purchasing a new photocopier for the office. This machine will be able to fold and staple the documents. It will make life much easier for Deb.

Finance. Apparently we have not been paying Deb enough salary and super for the last 18 months. This has been rectified. We will need to pay her approximately an extra \$2500 to get everything up to date. By the time we pay the Diocese each month we have to go into our reserves as we do not have anything left to pay our bills.
Balance in No 1 a/c at end April \$14,962.08

Vestry Ray (head verger) is going to put shelves on top of cupboard in vestry to store plastic containers. By doing this he hopes to be help to eliminate some of the items which are now on the floor.

Events The finance committee are considering several ways where we can raise some money for the church. More details later.

Youth Spotlight Handballing DangerBeware

Youth mental health and life challenges have been acknowledged as Real Rural problems so we thought we would" give it a go "looking at climbing personal mountains and not just sleeping on our opportunity but trying to get our whole church and wider community to wake up and actually do something about it. There has been a lot of headspace publicity the air has been thick with butterflies indicating support but just as amazing has been the total lack of real progress. It's not just headspace but waste of space that springs to mind. We might say the same thing in terms of Refugees. There is a great outcry with the killing of cattle and live export and appalling conditions but the same passion is lacking when it comes to Refugees fleeing turbulent situations. In a series of master handballing moves the Australian government pushes its responsibility offshore to a financial and politically vulnerable neighbour and pretends it's not a abuse of power. Handballing is something really easy to do but young Christians can help Churches and our community lift their game toward real action. These are a couple of ways that we are giving it a go.

Albury Youth summit Top Judge, Top Adventurers for Youth Summit

An afternoon to build youth resilience and help youth deal with life challenges, to overcome difficulties and turn "fears of failure: into success stories, was hosted by St Matthews Albury with Bishop John and the help of local corporate sponsors.. Michael Kirby an internationally renowned Anglican, lawyer and human rights advocate joined 2 young adventurers and youth motivators (Daniel Kuzeff and Will Elrick) engaging youth leaders and school representatives in equipping young people to deal with challenges.

The afternoon driven by local school and youth organisations sought to provide an immediate boost to youth challenges rather than waiting for a Headspace solution. The aim was to give individuals and school communities tools to overcome hurdles

Michael Kirby spoke of the challenges of youth and the isolation often felt through discrimination and initiated a vigorous discussion based on

dealing with difference and touching on matters of sexuality and marriage equality .There was very positive feedback from participating schools and again the wind of the spirit blew away some old misconceptions about churches initiating very contemporary social debate .



Pentecost a red letter day and the winds of change with Anglican Pizza Crisp not Crusty

Sunday 19th of May was a red letter day for musical ministry marking the feast of Pentecost as well as The 25th anniversary of the robed Choir of St Matthews Albury The church was bobbing with red helium balloons and the packed church featured more than twenty children and the youth group were well represented in the choir and sanctuary team it was a loud day. We had red streamers and loads of red candles and red everywhere. Change was in the air and so it was a bit of a surprise when The" Border mail "appeared to photograph the St Matthews youth in connection with a "church sleep

out " to raise awareness for homelessness and as part of an Albury Anglican Youth initiative to col-

lect blankets, sleeping bags and pillows to help the homeless .

No one seemed to mind that the service was a bit disrupted as the photos were taken because we understand that we need to pull together with lots of groups if we are going to make a real difference. No one actually bit our heads off even though the normal of service routine got a bit of a shake .

In fact there has been lots of support with an avalanche of blankets and emergency bedding being left and we have accepted of Beechworth Secondary College to help us adapt a bit of the Rectory to provide emergency accommodation. Building on the momentum we are leading the charge in the relay for life Cancer support walk and have launched our own team, St Matthews Angels and after the service we got a donation of a thousand dollars from someone in the community who wanted to help.

These ideas have come out of our fortnightly youth meetings with Morgan Howe and AAP Albury Anglican Pizza which are basically get-togethers from the youth who help in various ways in worship either reading or in the choir, in the sanctuary or in the congregation. So it's a pizza with a faith base and action topping.

This year's Relay for Life will be held on 26th/27th October commencing at 9.30am at Bunton Park North Albury with the survivors & carers walk. The candlelight ceremony will be at dusk. The event will conclude on Sunday morning at 9.30 am

The team has been registered. **To register on line enter Relay for Life 2013 Border, then find the team name .**

If you do not wish to register on line you can give your registration form & money to either Matthew-Paul or Kaye. Registration forms will be available in the narthex. Registration fee is \$15 if paid by 22nd August, from the 23rd August it will be \$20. The registration fee covers participation, a T shirt, breakfast, entertainment, event staging, safety & security e.g. St John's Ambulance

Relay for Life is an overnight community event where teams of 10 to 15 (we can have more than one team) participate in a relay –style walk or run to raise funds for the Cancer Council. The event brings the whole community together for a night of fun, entertainment, celebration & remembrance.

Relay for Life started in May 1985 by U.S colorectal surgeon Dr Gordy Klatt. He spent 24 hours circling a track in Tacoma Washington & raised \$27,000.

Since then Relay for Life has become the largest fund raising event for cancer in the world It is celebrated in over 600 communities across 21 countries.

Please consider being part of our team, remember it is not a race you can walk or run. It doesn't matter how long it takes you to circle the track. If you can only come for a short time that's all right. It would be good if we had someone on the track at all times. **If you intend taking part you must be registered, you can register on the day if you wish.**




