

#### Bringing the Harvest Home in Albury.

The last Sunday before Lent sees a something **more** than a traditional harvest festival with a happy marriage of tradition and children's family service that combines choral high mass with children's action songs. The corporate making of a harvest loaf, and animals during the service, Chickens were perched on hay bales next to the pulpit "thankfulness" theme bringing up food to the altar and distributed to needy individuals and families through "St Matthews Anglicare food room".

What a great way to begin Holy week "Stainers Crucifixion" – 12<sup>th</sup> April, Saturday night before Palm Sunday with special soloists and a "come and sing congregation".

Pews, incense and Pastoral care, God deals with us as whole people, and sometimes we have real bodily concerns that effect our life together, thanks to all those who take the time to mention ways on which we can care in practical ways .we are responding by trialling padded additions to our pews for greater comfort, please try one out and let us know what you think,

Incense causes a problem for some so once a month, on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday we are a "smoke free zone" there are also other concerns that might be raised and we will do our best to respond in a way that helps all of us.

Another **monster car boot** and garage sale – 8<sup>th</sup> March to help us help the homeless, starting at 8am to 12noon.

Upcoming Concerts and music  $-22^{nd}$  March is the Invenio Singers, and  $29^{th}$  March there will be a Gospel Choirs concert.

Get it together –fellowship opportunities, **men's breakfast** - 1<sup>st</sup> March (St Marks), 5<sup>th</sup> April (St Matthews).

Lent donations for 2014 will be to the wellness centre for local cancer relief and youth opportunity, there might be an opportunity during morning teas to give a small donation, there is a little band of people producing Sunday morning scones, you might like to donate SR flour or sugar, jam or anything else. You might even like to help at the Rectory before church 8am, give Essie a call and she will give you clear directions.

#### **PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

This will be the last report from the current Parish Council.

**Safety Issues**. A sensor light has been installed in the outdoor toilets.

**Rectory.** When Fr Peter moves to Adamshurst the rectory will then revert back to being used for Parish activities. Parish Council is considering putting someone in as a caretaker. This person would live upstairs. We are also considering putting an op shop in the old library, which would be opened probably Fridays and Saturday mornings. The back room would be used for church group meetings.

**Lights in the Church.** New lights were installed in the choir gallery. To prolong their use, the electrician has advised that they not be turned on for a few minutes, then turned off, which shortens their life span, but to leave them on until you have finished.

**Lent talks.** Fr Peter is talking to several people asking them to speak on Sunday mornings during Lent. On the Tuesday's during Lent he hopes to show classic films.

**Skirting boards** These are nearly ready to be put back.

Finances. Funds available in the no 1 a/c at 31<sup>st</sup>Jan \$19148.82 add transfer of funds from No2 a/.c (previously term deposit) \$5000. Plus funds transfer from Highgrove \$8,000, less cheques to be paid \$26232.66. Funds available \$5916.16.

Cathy Carden was thanked for all the work she had done during the past year as treasurer.

**Youth Group** Matthew-Paul Fowler along with the other members of the Youth committee have put together a programme for the youth.

**Anglican Food Room** 24 hampers were distributed during January and 254 packs of mince were received.

**Noticeboard.** Considering looking at a magnetic sign. The present notices are causing a lot of frustration.

**Parish Fete** will be held on Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> October—more details later

# MEDITATION The Hard Sayings of Jesus (2)

#### "But many that are first will be last, and the last first" (St Mark 10:31)

The Pharisees were regarded as among the most holy and pious members of the Jewish nation. They believed that this was a correct assessment of their life. In a parable of Jesus (The Pharisee and the Tax Gatherer – St Luke 18: 10-14) – the Pharisee prays "God, I thank you that I am not like other men...I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all I get." Jesus remarks however of the Pharisees, "on the outside you appear as righteous, but on the inside you are full of hypocrisy and wickedness". (St Matthew 23: 27-28) Why would He say this? Theirs was the sin of pride and pride is not the first of the Seven Deadly Sins for nothing. The Pharisees observed with exactitude, the Law which had been built up from The Ten Commandments over centuries. For example, in order to keep the Sabbath Day holy (4<sup>th</sup> Commandment) it was necessary to observe over 1000 rules and regulations! Again of the Pharisees Jesus said, "you neglect the more important matters of the Law – justice, mercy, and faithfulness". (St Matthew 23: 23-24)

Jesus then, condemns the Pharisees because of their pride in themselves. For us today, pride can be a barrier between ourselves and Our Heavenly Father. Our abilities, our achievements, our position in society or our living standards can blind us to the fact that these aspects of our life are gifts from God and are to be used in His service. They are a blessing as they can benefit not only ourselves, but others too. They must not however, become a barrier through pride, to our relationship with Our Heavenly Father. We need to acknowledge that they come from Him. We must not assume then, that the chief places in the Kingdom of God have been guaranteed for those who boast they have given up much to follow Jesus.

It is possible to take pride in one's self-denial and feel that by this means we have established a special claim on God. There will be some surprises in the Kingdom of God. Those who have been very prominent in this world may have to be very humble in the next; those who have not been noticed here may well be prominent in the world to come. The standards of heaven are not necessarily the standards of earth. Earth's first may be last and the last may be first. Jesus said, "love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength and love your neighbour as yourself...there is no commandment greater than these". (St Mark Ch: 12: Vs 29-34)




