

Dear People of St Matthew's

Easter isn't about death and suffering of someone totally remote from life in Albury, it is about transformation. Our Lenten lectures have all spoken to this theme. Young Victorian of the Year Jason Ball powerfully reminded us that people may not remember what we say or what we do but they will remember how we made them feel and challenged everyone to act with compassion. Father Rod Bower from Gosford, famous for his church signs challenged us to communicate differently and be the good news in our current world. Edward Santow, Australian Human Rights Commissioner, spoke of treating people from different backgrounds and religious perspectives with respect drawing from his own family background and asking questions about national policies to refugees. Practical compassion and kindness was also the theme of Sussan Ley's address 'Faith in the Firing Line' which was all about love in action. Reverend Dr Keith Mascord gave us new eyes to look upon old texts as he explored the intellectual 'cop out' of reading the bible in black and white and the resulting cruelty and injustice. He also invited us to be part of a national apology for damage to LGTBI people - again 'love in action'. Peter Evans, Deputy Chairman of Ramsay Health and Chairman of Ramsay Trust, gave a fascinating insight into making a difference in the community in health, education and the arts and pointed to the urgent need for governments and individuals to take up their opportunity. Tiernan Brady, Director of Australians for Equality, spoke of communities of hope and faith communities being part of a positive change. On Palm Sunday Julian Burnside AO QC, Human Rights Advocate, will highlight the minimum standards of practical kindness expected from governments and communities that have a background in the Christian tradition.

The Easter services are also on the theme of renewal and will be a good news message for all people all ages, and all faiths. As always, all invited, all welcome. Seniors Easter service where everyone is invited on Wednesday 12 April at 10.30am. If you would like Easter home communion, please contact the office.



MEDITATION





"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (St Matthew ch: 27 verse 46) and Jesus said

"It is finished." (St John ch: 19 verse 30)

For the three years of his ministry, Jesus had been proclaiming the New Covenant between God and humanity. The era of the Law, stretching over 1,400 years with its emphasis on Jewish religious life had ended. In Our Lord the new order was inaugurated. He gave his life "as a ransom for many". As St Paul writes, "God demonstrated his own love for us, in that while we were still sinful people, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8) He goes to the cross on our behalf so that those who trust in him and follow his example of life, will have a place with him in the kingdom of heaven.

Just before Jesus died, he cried out from the cross, asking why did it seem that God had forsaken him. Why did he say those words? Even though he was God, Jesus was also human, and on the cross he plumbed the uttermost depth of human experience – betrayal and crucifixion. We also experience tragedy in our own human existence, and can feel as if Our Heavenly Father has forgotten or deserted us.

Jesus had become apprehensive in the Garden of Gethsemane and asked... "if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will but as you will." (St Matthew 26:39) Our Lord knew that he must go through with it. He had a conviction that he would not be left alone. By doing this he showed us that there would be no place or situation that we may experience where he had not been before.

Jesus' last words spoken from the cross were "it is finished", and with that he died. He had successfully completed his task, he had won the struggle over sin and death. He died a victor with a shout of triumph on his lips.

If we too cling to God (even when he seems far away or even not there at all) and hold on to what remains of our faith and trust, we will win through. We need to stand firm in our refusal to believe that Our Heavenly Father has forgotten or deserted us. Just like Jesus, we need to have a sure confidence in the care and protection of Our Heavenly Father. "Either he will shield us from suffering or give us unfailing strength to bear it". (St Francis de Sales)

Always remember that "our hope lies not in the man we put on the moon, but in the man we put on the cross." (Don Basham)

"There is a green hill far away, outside a city wall,

Where the dear Lord was crucified, who died to save us all.

He died that we might be forgiven, he died to make us good;

That we might go at last to Heaven, saved by his precious blood."


