Fr Peter writes: Dear People of St Matthew's

This wonderful hymn recently used in the Royal Wedding seems to be a favourite all over the world, it was written William Williams, who had a bit of a struggle with the Church of England and while he was deacon he was off the list for anything else but nevertheless used his own opportunities to spread a message of God's love. Bishop Michael Curry has similarly been off the list because of his views on an inclusive society and yet has had the chance to spread a global message which is unlikely to be forgotten in a hurry.

Also unlikely to be forgotten two recent events at St Matthews. The Chamber Music Festival Launch and Libby Gilchrist's book launch on the 5th and 6th May respectively, both occasions the music was transporting. The Chamber Music Festival attracted people from Sydney and Melbourne including our festival patron Nance Grant, Professor Geoffrey and Ann Blainey and Greg Loveday who have founding patrons of our music association. St Matthews Music Association also had two landmark events that we should be very proud of. Two of our St Matthews music association scholars have covered themselves in glory and shown the real community benefit of the project and the support.

Thomas Summerfield who also played during the festival reception has been chosen to represent the Eastern Schools of the Anglican Schools Commission in a national competition in Perth and James Flores was the organist in the border premier of the mass and chorale work by the famous French organist and composer Louis Vierne and the choir from the Murray Conservatorium under the direction of Jeff Mosher. For a work of this scale any regional centre would normally need to import a guest organist but because of the local tuition made available by our association our organist was home grown and this represents an enormous achievement for Albury and St Matthews.

Our **Tunes on Tuesday** in June (5th & 19th) welcomes Scots School and James Flores.

Winter Solstice (21st June) is now a commemoration highlighting mental health and youth suicide and survival and St Matthews has been apart of this from the beginning. And we look forward to this important event with speakers of


Pastoral Care. This appears to be going well





NEWS FROM THE BELFRY

In 1999 while travelling with my husband in New Zealand, I was privileged to ring the bells in Christchurch Cathedral, an experience which I will never forget. I loved Christchurch and felt some sort of connection.

When informed of the devastating earthquake on 22/2/11 and the damage to the Cathedral, I was heartbroken. Not only was the Cathedral badly damaged, but the bells had



I had another trip back to NZ early in 2014 and took the opportunity to go to Christchurch to survey the damage for myself. I could not believe my eyes. Nothing had been done to the Cathedral, and as a matter of fact no decision had been made about its future at all. Too many more important needs had to be met before that could happen. As an interim measure, the "Cardboard Cathedral" was built until a decision could be made about the future of the Cathedral. Plans were formulated to build a stand-alone belltower, possibly out of shipping containers.

Again, in March this year I visited Christchurch. This was to be my last trip to NZ and I wanted one last look at Christchurch. Much building had taken place in the central square but the Cathedral was as desolate as ever. However, good news about its future, a decision had been made last November to rebuild the Cathedral to its original plan, but, it could be another 10 years before this happens.

And the bells? Well, a small ring of six has been donated and when sufficient funds have been raised a stand-alone tower will be built on the lawn beside the Cardboard Cathedral. This could happen within two years. In the meantime, nothing has changed at the site of the original Cathedral.






