MEDITATION THE DIFFERENCE EASTER MAKES

"He is not here, He is risen." (Mark 16:6)

Like Christmas, Easter has been commercialised by the secular world. People interviewed give a variety of answers as to what Easter means to them – holidays, hot cross buns, Easter eggs and Bunnies, catching up on jobs. But the real meaning of Easter is the basis of Christianity.

The resurrection isn't fiction or fantasy. Eyewitnesses gave first hand accounts of the events at that time. Following his resurrection, Jesus made numerous appearances- to Mary Magdalene, the eleven in the upper room, the two travellers to Emmaus and the crowd of over 500, to name a few. The resurrection of Jesus and his appearances to a long line of witnesses, is at the very heart of the gospel as proclaimed by the Christian Church. Without these accounts, there would be no gospel and no church.

The disciples met with the resurrected Jesus and were changed. They had a new energy and vitality and weren't afraid any more. They preached boldly and were prepared to die for their faith.

So what do these proofs of the resurrection mean to us today? (1)The effect that the living and risen Lord has on individual believers and the community of believers (the church) right to this day cannot be denied. The faithful proclaim that Christ still lives, and the work of his kingdom continues. The uniqueness of the Easter message is that it changes the lives of those who are touched by it. Through Christ, new life can spring out of hopelessness and despair. Hardened hearts can come alive. No situation is without hope, for Christ is present in every circumstance of life, no matter how difficult the problem may be.

(2) God's love cannot be destroyed by death. In his Easter Sermon in 2008, the Archbishop of Canterbury noted, "when death happens, only God is left. We have no choice but to let go of all we cling to, but God remains. His unshakeable love is untouched by death, and all we do and all we care about matters to him." The fact that Jesus is risen, means that every person has the opportunity of life forever in the presence of Our Heavenly Father. St Paul asks the question, "death, where is your sting? Grave, where is your victory?"


In Jesus, death has no sting and the grave is defeated.






