
# **KEEPING CONNECTED TO OUR ST MATTHEW'S FAMILY**

Just as we were planning our Harvest Festival an amazing piece of good news leapt up as our statue of St Francis destroyed by vandalism a few months ago was beautifully restored and placed back in the centre of the Childrens Labarynth. One of the many quiet supporters of St Matthew's, Les Langmead who uses St Matthew's and the garden as a place of quiet reflection felt moved to offer his skills to raise up that which was cast down. St Francis is a great symbol of hope, kindness and goodwill just as the building of St Matthew's destroyed by fire 30 years ago but rebuilt by the whole community is a sign of good overcoming evil and people reaching out to each other in a time

of need which is a message of St Francis and is the message St Matthew's lives out day by day and cares for the community.

The angel also destroyed has now been taken away and under his healing hands will soon be restored. Thanks also to all those kind people who were in touch, there are so many reasons to say 'Thank You'.



The passing of Patricia Gould OAM was marked by a huge farewell at St Matthew's with her five sons and their families and many representatives from her time serving the community. The music was spectacular with many thanks to David Luxon on Organ, Dylan Forge Vocalist and Billy Stewart our Trumpeter. There were special tributes from Deputy Leader of the Opposition, Sussan Ley and Mayor Kylie King and a warm tribute from her family.

At the conclusion of the Service the bells of St Matthew's were ringing out over Albury as the Pipes and Drums of the Scots School led the cortege up Kiewa Street up to the Council Offices where employees of Albury City were lined up on each floor of the building in respect.




# **Update St Matthew's Pipe Organ**
