## **Readings this week**

# The first reading comes from the 3<sup>rd</sup> Chapter 1 Kings - Solomon prays for wisdom

The LORD appeared to Solomon in a dream by night; and God said, "What would you like me to do for you?" And Solomon said, "You have always shown great love to my father David, because he walked before you in faithfulness, in righteousness, and in uprightness of heart; and you have loved him and given him a son to sit on his throne today. And now, you have made me king in place of my father David, even though I am so young and inexperienced and don't know what I am doing! I am leading so many people it seems beyond me. Please give me wisdom and understanding so that I can govern your people properly. I need to see good from evil so I can lead them in the right direction. It pleased the Lord that Solomon had asked this. God said to him, "Because you have asked this, and have not asked for long life or riches for yourself, and haven't asked me to destroy your enemies, I will answer your prayer and give you a wise and discerning mind; you will be the greatest king in history both from the past and into the future. **Thanks be to God.** 

# The Gospel reading comes from the thirteenth Chapter of Matthew – Jesus tells parables to explain a new type of government where all people are welcomed. He explains that heavenly connection with God and each other is the most valuable thing in the world.

Jesus told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in his field; it is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches." He told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three cups of flour until all the dough was risen."

"Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; on finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it. For the Word of God in scripture, for the word of god among us, For the Word of God within us. Thanks be to God.


