If you do not have a mobile phone, you are able to register manually on the sign-on sheet on arrival. We are asking that people start arriving at 8:40 am so you have time to register and maintain safe social distance. Sanitising and safe personal hygiene procedures are still a requirement at the time of arrival.

"Wow! Donations, donations and more donations!!" said someone as they walked into the back room at the Rectory ... Parish members and others have been incredibly generous givers. A lot has been donated for the homeless and so much came in as a result of the bushfire appeal, that there were lots of lovely things left over in store.

Basing our thinking on the need to connect what we have with those in need, we have begun a sort-out in the back room.

Our Op-Shop group does a fantastic job preparing and selling a good deal of clothing etc. but as the space is very small, it's too hard to store everything at the shop. Once the sorting is done, we plan to make it easy to select goods to sell in the shop. After speaking to Lynne and John at the Op-Shop, we found we would also need other outlets for surplus donations. To that end, we have been in touch with other local charities, and each seems to have their speciality.

Vinnies will take clean clothes and shoes. Lifeline will take anything at all and they have a large group of sorters, transport and contacts, and are able to ship things here, there and overseas to partner charities. It is all recycled. To that end, we have shared with them some things that have been in storage for some time.

Did you know that COVID-19 has altered shopping patterns? Currently there is little or no call for men's suits and lady's office wear and even party outfits. Jack's Rags buys cotton and polyester clothes, and these are sold to them for sorting and re-sale.

We have set aside a small room to have easily accessible things for those in dire or urgent need. We have sorted a range of men's, women's, and children's clothing, sleeping gear, bathroom and hygiene packs. This room will be kept topped up from future donations.

The Pastoral Care Group are able to make use of the lovely hand-made knee rugs that we have in storage. When and where possible, they take them to nursing homes and they also make use of some of the hygiene packs.

Lately we have been popping a beanie or two in with food packs – we're not sure how that goes, as we have not had any feedback yet.

COVID-19 has been very disruptive and as such, we have faced some logistical challenges that have resulted in a backlog of donations, but we are in the process of reorganising things so that our aim to connect all your generous donations with people in need is met.

If any of you are wondering where your gifts are going, please rest assured that it is our priority to ensure your generosity is not wasted and supporting our local community remains our focus.
